Warm tones for a homely atmosphere

Bureau Kroner architects transformed an existing office building into a welcoming place for the Council for the Protection of Children. Children are central to the design. They have to feel comfortable and safe there. The starting point for the interior was therefore 'the horizon' of children: the proportions of spaces, of walls and façades and of the permanent furnishings were designed with the idea that children of all ages feel welcome. The colours and materials used are based on the house style of the Council for the Protection of Children and have been specifically adapted to the prerequisites of the location. All the basic elements in the interior have a natural look: wood, sisal and carpet in subtle sand colours create a warm, homely atmosphere, and keep the scale of the rooms modest and friendly. New materials have been carefully selected on the basis of their sustainability characteristics. Floors are made of circularly reusable material. The new façades on the ground floor are made of Accoya wood, the most sustainable cultivated and environmentally friendly treated wood available.
